## Why Slovenia Is Gaining Popularity with American Retirees

Many retirees report living comfortably on \$1,700-\$2,200 per month, including rent. This is within the budget of most Social Security recipients, whose average monthly benefit is approximately \$1,975.

## Healthcare Options for Retirees

---

Slovenia offers excellent healthcare options for retirees:

### Public Healthcare

Slovenia's public healthcare system is among the best in Central Europe and available to legal residents who contribute to the system. The quality is generally high throughout the country.

## Private Healthcare

Private healthcare is affordable compared to U.S. prices: - Doctor visit: \$30-\$60 - Specialist consultation: \$50-\$100 - Hospital stay: \$150-\$350 per day - Common procedures cost 50-70% less than in the U.S.

## Insurance Options

1. **Slovenian Public Insurance:** Mandatory for residents, approximately €30-€50 (\$33-\$55) monthly.
2. **Supplemental Insurance:** Most residents also purchase supplemental coverage for €25-€35 (\$27-\$38) monthly.
3. **International Insurance:** Policies designed for expatriates, typically \$150-\$300 monthly.

## Medicare Considerations

Medicare generally doesn't cover healthcare outside the U.S., except for certain Medicare Advantage plans, for emergencies. Retirees should consider: - Returning to the U.S. for planned procedures covered by Medicare - Maintaining Medicare Part B for coverage during U.S. visits - Supplementing with Slovenian or international insurance

## Visa and Residency Requirements

---

Slovenia offers several residency options for retirees:

### Temporary Residence Permit

- Valid for 1 year, renewable
- Must apply at Slovenian embassy or consulate in the U.S. or at administrative unit in Slovenia
- Can lead to permanent residency after 5 years

### Requirements for Retirees

1. **Proof of Income:** Evidence of sufficient funds (approximately €1,000/month or \$1,100)
2. **Health Insurance:** Valid coverage in Slovenia
3. **Accommodation:** Proof of housing (rental contract or property ownership)
4. **Clean Criminal Record:** Background check from home country

### Process Overview

1. Apply for temporary residence permit
2. Provide required documentation
3. Register address with local authorities

4. Obtain residence card
5. Renew annually

## Other Visa Options

- **Self-employed Visa:** For those starting a business
- **Family Reunification:** For those with Slovenian spouses or relatives
